

Criteria for Funding CPT Projects

1. Project must show collaboration with at least one other group listing partners' names and contact information
2. Something that could not happen without the CPT must not supplant existing programs or funds
3. Leverages at least \$2 for every \$1 given full documentation of volunteers, in-kind and expenses
4. Direct connection to CPT and CFC goals may include 40 Developmental Assets
5. Diversity of age groups both in planning and in participants
6. Outcome measurement process numbers, survey, impact on the community
7. Reporting process includes a narrative report and data (December, June)
8. Project must come through a board member or workgroup prefer long term relationship with project leader
9. Project must be a part of our Strategic Plan emerging needs must coordinate with at least one existing goal
10. Hard copy submitted at least one week prior to decision by board electronic version is also required to be sent to board president for determination of completeness
11. Complete project budget must be included with request
